This season we hosted the AL State Mixed held at Redstone Lanes. We will be having 2 more upcoming State tournaments in the new season. Once again, we will be hosting the AL State Mixed in June 2024 at Bowl Madison and the AL State Senior Tournament in October 2024 at Redstone Lanes.

The AL State Open will be in Huntsville during the 25-26 Season and the Woman will be during the 26-25 Season. The Youth will not be until the 29-30 Season, that is unless they make a change of that schedule.

We had board members attend the National Meeting in Las Vegas at South Point this year. Here are a few things covered.

New Online League Sign-Up starting with youth leagues. Parents will be able to register their kids for a league, and pay sanction fees. These will be set up by the centers. The information will transfer into the local data system. This is being tested now and USBC is hoping it will be active this fall.

Lane Inspection will start this summer with Bowl Madison and Redstone being done in the next month or so. AMF Pin Palace and Family Lanes in October of 2024 and AMF River City and Stars and Strikes in January 2025. The Association Manager will be contacted 90 days prior to area inspection to be sure center contacts are current. The centers will be put in a Tier System based on how they do on the inspection. The inspection will be good for 3 years unless a center does not meet the bear minimum and those will have to be re-inspected the following year. Word is the levels will be called Gold, Silver and Bronze.

String Pins and USBC: USBC will now be certifying centers with string pin play. Average with string pin lanes will be kept separate as a record. So, bowlers will be able to have a string pin average and free falling or 10 pin average. Effective August 1, 2023.

Lane Inspection by USBC: Redstone has been contacted by USBC and lanes there will be inspected after the 1st of the year in 2023. Not sure if any of the other houses have been contacted yet.
